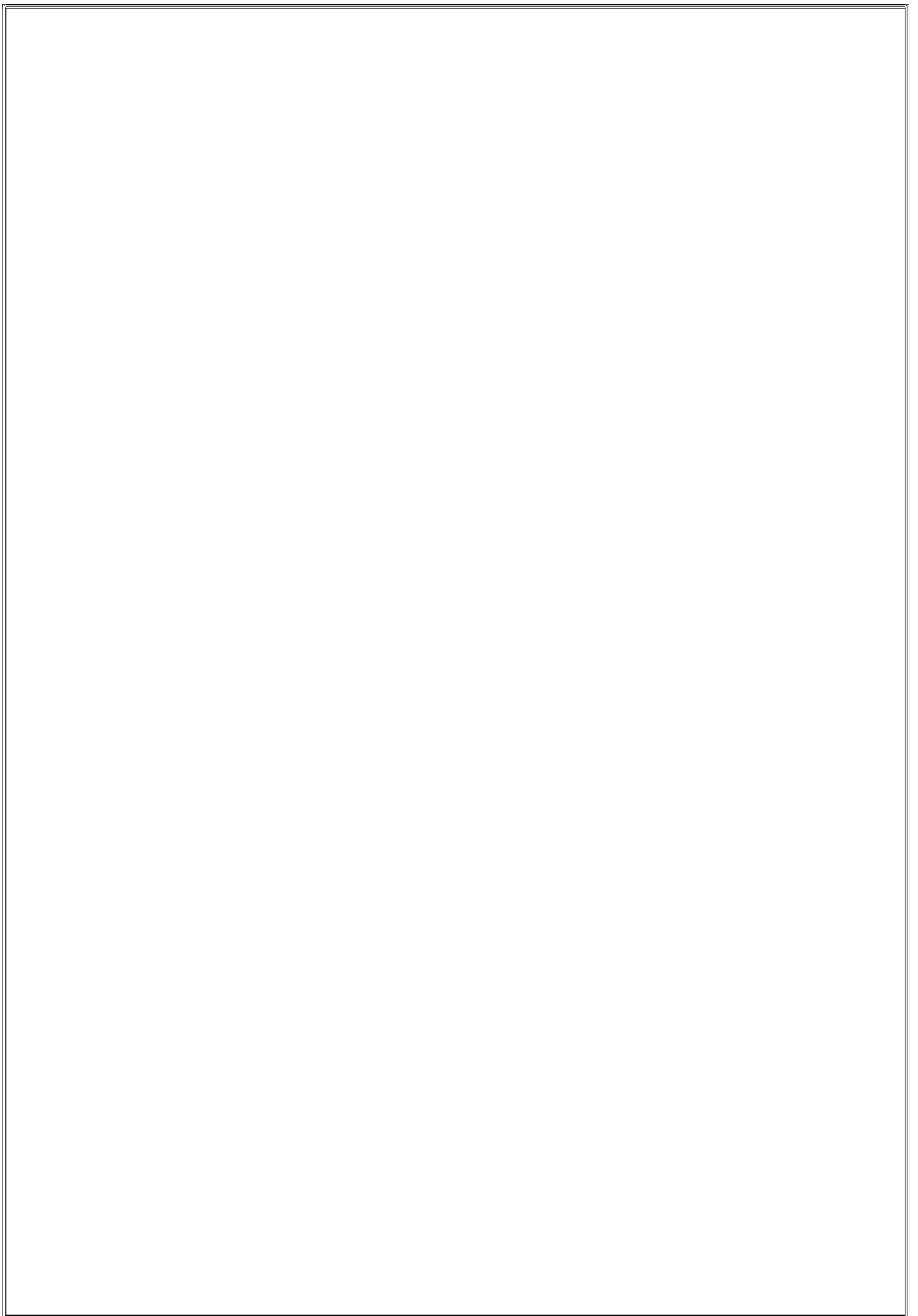

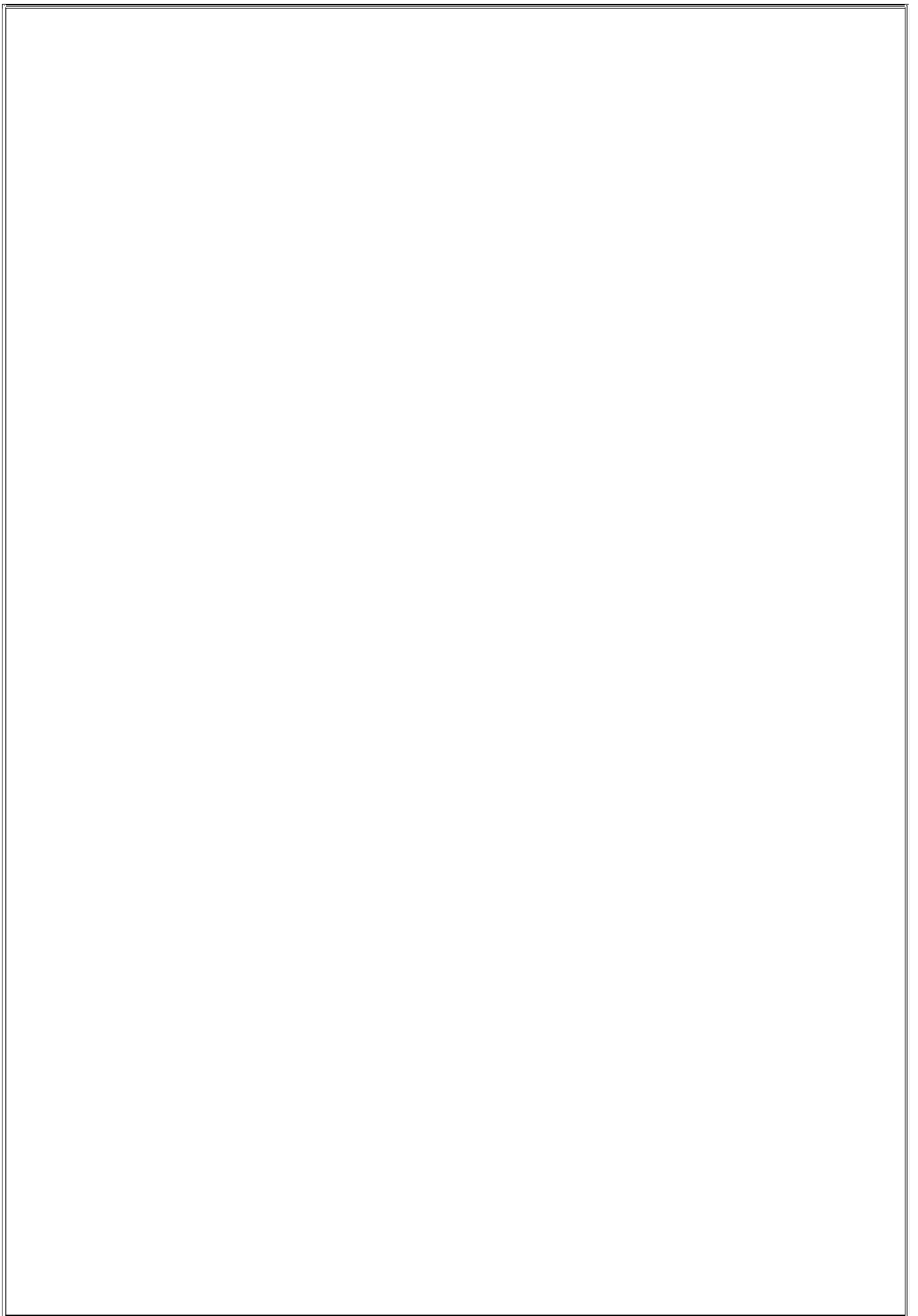

1. The Principal, before starting the formal proceedings of the meeting, expressed profound grief and sorrow over the sad demise of our legendary, iconic educationists, outstanding academician and illuminous light of Ashok Memorial Public School, honoured members of School Managing Committee, Dr. Miss Shakti Kapoor and Sh. J.N Sharma ji. While making obituary reference, she stated that the void created by their demise cannot be filled and Chairperson Sh. Baldev Mahajan also joined in paying heartfelt tribute to the departed souls by enunciating that they were heart and soul of this institution and also recalled their invaluable contribution in the field of education and stated that this is really irreparable loss. All members observed one minute silence to pay homage to the departed souls.

Then Principal in her welcome address expressed her gratitude towards the chairperson, the chairman and other members of the School Managing Committee for their constant guidance and unstinted support. The Chairperson also welcomed the special invitees who were attending the meeting for the first time and stated that indeed last two years were very difficult and challenging due to the spread of pandemic He stated that this pandemic enhanced our technological skills but there is no substitute for children attending the school physically.

2. The minutes of the previous meeting held on October 19, 2019 were unanimously approved by the members.
3. Action Taken Report in respect of the previous meeting was read. The follow up action taken was appreciated by the members.
 - (a) It was appreciated that the extra classes were arranged for the slow learners for classes VI to XII during summer break. The Chairperson applauded this effort and stated that this would help to strive for excellence, as special tutorial classes are being started at an early stage. He was of the view that at this age, it is easy to bring them at par with other students, with support and guidance. He strongly advised to continue this good practice.
 - (b) The Principal presented the Annual Report. All the members appreciated the report for exhaustive coverage of the academics, curricular and co-curricular activities of the school. The emphasis on holistic development was noted with great appreciation.

IV. The following observations were made in respect of the agenda items:-

1. **Analysis of the Board Result:** All members appreciated the Board results of class X and XII. Sh. Mahajan ji, Chairperson, congratulated the management, Principal and Teachers and also appreciated the average aggregate marks obtained by the students in all the subjects especially the average aggregate marks obtained in Humanities. He also emphasized that the PQI (Performance Quality Index) that this school is maintaining, is at par with best schools of the country.
2. **Enrolment Position:** Principal made all the members aware that the enrolment was impacted by the pandemic but she stated that they are able to cover up the loss due to the school's reputation of excellent results and good discipline.
3. **Staff Position:** All members were happy to note that good and competent teachers are employed. Sh. Mahajan ji congratulated the Principal for starting the vocational subjects. He stated that there should be separate faculty for vocational subjects. He was of the view that a separate meeting should be arranged to look deep into this initiative and it should be strengthened. The Chairperson was elated to know regarding the implementation of seventh pay commission with respect to the maximum number of teachers. He also applauded the efforts of the management that the teachers are being rewarded for giving excellent results. Regarding attending the In-Service Teachers Training Programme, the Chairperson appreciated it by saying that it will definitely strengthen our faculty and will help them in their growth.
4. **Value Education:** All members appreciated the way value education is being imparted to the students. Chairperson Mahajan ji was of the view that the way social activities are conducted in the school, they naturally develop values among the students and side by side they are learning Community Services also.
5. **Physical Fitness and Participation in Games and Sports:** All members were elated to know the achievement in the field of Sports and Games. The Chairperson emphasized that we should make a vision that each child of our school will be physically fit. For this, mass participation in games, should be the sole aim of the school.

6. Learning achievement of Primary School Students and Enhancing over –all academic quality: Chairperson appreciated the extra classes being conducted regularly for slow learners and also advised to continue it. He emphasized that teachers must keep on assessing the learning achievement of the children regularly and must pay individual attention. This will improve overall quality in academics.

7. Development of Green School: All the members appreciated the school achievement of “Green School Award”. The Chairperson appreciated it by saying that this is a unique feature of the school and a real tribute to the founders of the school. He advised to maintain it in future also.

All the members, especially chairperson, appreciated the NCC and Scout and Guide achievements by the school students. He emphasized that Inter-House activities are very important for the holistic growth of the children and appreciated that these are being organized at different levels. He also advised to organize Inter-School Activities to commemorate the memory of our founders.

Mrs. Bharti Kukkal Principal KVS advised to implement vocational courses from class VI onwards.

The Parent-member, Mr. Ajoy Kar suggested that the school should introduce Robotics and Mr. Vijay Singh (Parent-Member) also advised to invite the old alumni of the school who are on prestigious posts or pursuing their career from some prestigious institutions to guide the students.

The Principal expressed her gratitude to all the members for their support and guidance. She assured them that all the suggestions given by the members will be implemented in the true spirit. The Vote of Thanks was proposed by Mrs. Pratima Oberoi.

2. **Special tutorial classes (Extra classes):** As advised by Sh. Mahajan ji extra classes during the summer break and after school were arranged for the slow learners from classes 6th to 12th, who were identified in the beginning of the session.
3. **Enrolment Position:** Enrolment position during the pandemic became bit low but we covered up the strength very quickly this year whereas we did not move away from our focus of taking meritorious students only. *(Detail in Report)*
4. **Counselling and Seminars:** To keep themselves updated with the latest techniques of teaching all teachers attended a number of workshops conducted by **CBSE** on online mode. Every teacher did many courses of his/her choice through Diksha Portal. This year one day workshop was organized on 30th June, 2023 in the school premises. *(Detail in Report)*
5. **Scholastic Activities:** The children participated in Olympiads and other Co-scholastic Activities and brought laurels to the school. The whole academic year is built around a hub of Inter house activities divided into three levels: primary middle and secondary and senior secondary and has been made sure that maximum children must participate in these activities.
6. **Sports:** As advised by Sh. Mahajan Ji during his visit to school mass participation in different games in school premises itself is encouraged. The sports like athletics, skipping, jogging, and running etc. are made compulsory on regular basis. Test run to determine the physical fitness of boys and girls separately according to different age groups was conducted and children participated in it very enthusiastically. We organised Annual Sports Day also. *(Detail in Report)*
7. **Green School:** We are the recipient of “**Green School Award**” presented by **CSE (Centre of Science and Environment)** from past seven years. This year also we maintained the status and won the certificate again. *(Detail in Report)*
8. **Vocational Subjects:** As suggested by Mrs Bharti Kukkal, we have introduced Chess, Music, Cooking, Coding, Web Designing, Artificial Intelligence, Data Science and Financial Literacy in classes VI to VIII.
9. **Robotics:** As advised by the parent member Mr. Ajoy Kar to introduce Robotics, I am elated to announce that in the beginning of this session we started our Robotics Club. *(Detail in Report)*
10. **Alumni invited for guidance:** As suggested by the parent member Mr. Vijay Singh, we invited our alumni to guide our present class XII students. *(Detail in Report)*

It gives me immense pleasure to share the Annual Report for the session 2022-23 as an account of the school operations and achievements throughout the year and the progress the school has made to provide high quality educational opportunities for all the students.

Campus

Our campus is a vast expanse of over four acres and provides a perfect ambience for an aesthetically chartered school building. Open lawns mark a colourful bonanza of fresh floral bounty. The school has a large building complex with all modern amenities like spacious well-ventilated classrooms, with sturdy furniture, extensive display boards and latest teaching aids. At present 57 classrooms are equipped with smart boards to facilitate the learning of the students. Another floor on the existing building has already been added to meet the specific requirements of the rooms. Now we have three storey school building. To enhance mobility, lift is installed.

A scientific temperament is nurtured through fully equipped and suitably designed laboratories for Physics, Chemistry, Biology, Maths and Computer Science. Students are encouraged to use the facilities for enhancing their innovative and scientific skills. Three more Computer Labs, one big Art Room and a Home Science Lab are added in the present infrastructure.

I would like to express my sincere gratitude to the school management for their thoughtful and proactive approach in enhancing our school’s infrastructure

The school believes in inculcating and enhancing reading culture amongst its students. The campus lays claim to a trove of 15000 plus books in our library for all the age groups of students and facilitators. It also subscribes to various magazines and periodicals covering varied topics and stocks CD/DVD’s with subject related content. One Junior Library is also added on the third floor.

The school clinic is well equipped to take care of minor exigencies. In case of an emergency, the school takes the ailing child to the hospital while parents are kept informed.

The school provides an excellent transport service to ferry the students under the strict vigilance of trained staff. All the buses are equipped with First-Aid-Kit, GPRS Tracking System and CCTV’s. We are implementing RFID enabled tracking system, initially for all school buses that will provide information through SMS to the parent that the child has boarded or deboarded the bus, the timings and live location of the buses. In next phase we will start the same process for all the school children.

Safety and Security

Safety and Security of the Children is of paramount importance for the school. Entire school building is under CCTV Surveillance. Fire extinguishers are installed on each floor and fire fighting system using water is working well. School has already done the police verification of all support staff. Female attendants have been positioned near the washrooms to guard the area. Female attendants in the bus and conductors carry mobiles to contact the parents in case of emergency. PTI as well as the teachers are pre assigned their duties in different areas such as playground, staircase etc. during lunch break, boarding time apart from their regular scheduled time table. Class teachers have formed the whatsapp group of all the parents of their class. This platform is used to communicate important issues to them.

Scholastic Planning of the School

We strive to make our students successful learners, confident individuals and responsible citizens. Thus, we are following CBSE guidelines to provide quality education to promote intellectual, social and cultural vivacity among our learners which includes four Periodic Test, Half yearly and Annual Examination.

School Almanac and School Calendar containing the whole year planning of activities (Scholastic and co-curricular) is prepared well in advance before the commencement of the new session.

Detailed syllabus along with blueprint of question paper and revision schedule is duly given to the students in the beginning of the new session.

1. CBSE has introduced **Vocational Courses** that offer practical skills and hands on training that trains the students for specific jobs. So as per CBSE guidelines this year the school has introduced a wide range of vocational courses for the students of class **IX and XII** to fill the gap between skill required and skill produced. In **Class IX**, Introduction to Financial Markets, Banking & Insurance, Artificial Intelligence, Information Technology and in **Class XI** Banking, Financial Markets Management, Food Nutrition and Dietetics, Insurance, Geospatial Technology, Mass Media Studies, Library, Data Science, Artificial Intelligence are the vocational subjects as advised by Chair person Mahajan Ji in the last meeting. We have tried to strengthen it. We have also introduced Chess, Music, Cooking, Coding, Web Designing, Artificial Intelligence, Data Science and Financial Literacy in classes VI to VIII.

Keeping ourselves up with the pace of modern world, complete digitization of the school was undertaken which brought transparency and enhanced communication between parents and teachers. By launching the School App on school's web portal, the parents, teachers and school itself has numerous advantages-

- Parents can keep a real time track of the status of their child for daily attendance.
- Parents have a direct access to communicate with the class teacher for regular update of their child.

- Parents and teachers have been brought closer as this software provide direct upload of the daily homework on the online portal.
- The conventional regime of manually prepared report cards by the teachers is replaced with Computer Generated Report Cards.

The annual progress record of the students including academic, co-curricular and medical history is kept in the **Portfolios**.

Teachers forecast their detailed weekly planning of their subjects taken in the various classes well in advance. They plan for their respective classes a day before in their **Planning Register** daily, depicting topics to be taught, objective or goal to be achieved, method of teaching and the class work and homework that is to be given to the students.

The school diligently follow ‘**No Homework policy**’ for class Nursery to II. To reduce the burden of heavy school bags, new storage racks containing individual storage containers, are installed in **Ashok’s Kids Paradise** and in class I and II also. As per the CBSE guidelines to relieve the students from the burden of the exams, the children are being assessed on their day-to-day performance instead of formal exams. Their reports are being generated quarterly by the teachers on certain competencies in each subject including curricular and co-curricular activities.

Education is a shared commitment between dedicated teachers, motivated students and enthusiastic parents with high expectations. Parents play an active role in their child’s education and can further encourage and influence their child to perform well in school. Thus, **Parent Teacher Meeting** is a regular feature of the school. It is a great opportunity for parents as well as teachers to develop a healthy and strong relationship for the holistic development of the students.

No Bag Day

The new educational policy encourages that all student will participate in bagless period.

Keeping this in mind the school has initiated bagless days for all classes on rotational basis.

In a day three sections – one from primary, one from middle and one from secondary classes come to school without bags.

Activities like interacting with each other, working in school garden, craft activities like pottery, paper bag making, needle and thread activities, visit to Government School and interacting with the students were planned in advance to make it a memorable and fruitful day. These activities enable them to become more creative and better learners.

Scholarships and Fee Concession

As school motto is 'Service to Humanity'. Its real aim is to impart quality education to the weaker section of the society. The aim which our dearest Bauji kept in his mind while opening this school is very well taken up by our generous and philanthropist Chairman Sh. Vinod Sachdeva ji. A number of deserving candidates are given fee concession and bright children are getting merit scholarships.

Approximately 211 students are getting full or partial fee concession and round about 36 students are getting Merit scholarships. Every year from Class VIII academically excellent students are selected for Sh. G.L. Sachdeva and Sh. B.L. Sachdeva Scholarship and they get the scholarship till they pass class XII.

Faculty Position

A motivated, dedicated and well qualified faculty oversees the well-being of our students. At present we have **121 teachers** and **2720 students**. We have 12 Office Staff and 50 Group D employees including drivers and conductors. A good teacher-student ratio (1:25) makes it possible for our faculty to monitor the progress of every child. The faculty is comfortable in using modern technologies such as computers and Smart Boards and automated School Management Software for classroom teaching, lesson plans, assignments and evaluation to make learning more interactive and effective.

IN SERVICE TEACHERS TRAINING PROGRAMME

a) Workshop on Foundational Stage June 30,2023

The School organised an **enriching Teachers Training Program on June 30, 2023** on ' **Foundational Stage** ' to keep the faculty abreast as per the New Educational Policy. The **resource person** was **Mrs. Sharda Kumari** from SCERT. In the training she discussed about major shift in Education due to **NEP, Nipun Bharat Program** which is a **National Initiative** for proficiency with understanding in reading and numeracy and also narrated its importance. Through 'Om' chanting, she explained the voice modulation, which is very important for the teachers. She also narrated the different ways of teaching like letter approach, whole language approach, word approach and emphasized the teachers to follow language approach. She also explained the curriculum goals for different domains like physical, cognitive, socio- emotional, ethical, and language and literacy development as well as aesthetic and cultural development etc.

Whole session was learner centred with questionnaires, discussion and sharing of experiences. The program culminated expressing gratitude to the resource person and the very ambiance reaffirmed the commitment of the teachers for providing quality education.

b) Mathematics Workshop January 10, 2023

The workshop on **Activity Based Mathematics** was organised on **January 10, 2023** in the school premises for Mathematics teachers and Mother teachers of Class I and II. The **resource person** for this workshop was **Mr. Syed F Sattar**.

Key **Objectives** of the workshop were:

- To equip the teachers with variety of activities in teaching and learning Mathematics.
- To strengthen the teachers in planning and visualising lesson.
- To make Mathematics more interesting, interactive and enjoyable.

The session was interactive with the incorporation of entertaining activities on different Mathematical concepts like innovative ideas for the lower classes, how to introduce time concept, fraction and percentage activities with the help of paper cutting, Mental Maths tricks, how to inculcate Arts in daily teaching process, finding area and perimeter by forming different shapes, concept of algebraic expression through blocks, concept of addition, subtraction through blocks etc.

Workshops for Children

Medha Yoga Workshop- 6th Dec-8th Dec, 2022 by Art of Living:

A three day “**Medha Yoga Workshop**” from Dec 6th to Dec 8th was organised by the “**Art of Living**” for the students of class XII in the school premises. They learnt how to give 100% in studies as well as in life. They learnt this by various games and activities. They did Surya Namaskar, Pranayama and Sudarshan Kriya also. It was really an amazing programme. It helped them to empower physically, mentally and emotionally. Students also found it beneficial for reducing the level of stress and were able to focus on learning. They were of the view that it not only gave them peace of mind but also a sense of freshness and energy to move forward in life.

Social Etiquettes & Attitudinal Values -30 Oct,2022

A workshop for the students of class VI and VII was organised on “Social Etiquettes and Attitudinal Values” by the resource person “Prashant Tiwari”. Students learnt about social etiquettes in a play way manner. The facilitator was able to motivate the students to change their behaviour in a positive way. He also took the session on Career Counselling with class IX and X. “**What after class X**” was the main topic. Choosing subjects carefully- not under peer pressure, parental pressure was the main issue. Students found it really fruitful session.

Workshop on Career Counselling

Workshop on “**Career Counselling**” was organised for the students of **Class XI and XII** with the collaboration of **Times of India**. The resource person was **Mr. Vivek Varshney**. He himself is an **IITian** from **Guwahati**. He guided the children how to get success in academics. The students felt motivated after it.

Ashok's Kidz Paradise

In our kindergarten section, we create an environment where children can relish the joy of learning and realize their full potential in academics, social interactions, and personal growth. This approach equips them with the confidence and responsibility needed in an ever-evolving world.

Following the guidance of Sh. Mahajan ji, our children freely engage in playtime at the playground for approximately one hour, which includes both structured and unstructured play. Recognizing the importance of free outdoor play in nurturing their development, we ensure this integral component.

Outdoor activities play a pivotal role in introducing children to the wider world, enabling them to acquire essential life skills encompassing social, verbal, listening, and communication skills

As Sh. Mahajan Ji pointed out, our current student-teacher ratio stands at 25:2, employing the mother-teacher concept. Various engaging activities such as balancing the ball, puzzles, sensory games, number games, shoe lacing, and more are organized to encourage critical thinking, reasoning, questioning, and experimentation.

Sh. Mahajan Ji, suggested to use bilingual approach for kindergarten learners to ensure children feel comfortable and maintain their confidence without any sense of inadequacy. So, while learning is going on we often explain them the meaning of the question and difficult words in Hindi and give some examples too. We also ask our children to express their thoughts in Hindi if they find comfort in doing so. The idea is to initiate communicating skills in the simplest possible way.

As Sir pointed out, Striking the right balance between learning and fun is essential to nurture their curiosity and ignite their creative potential, every year school plans various activities like Show and Tell, Recitation, Card making, Clay Moulding, Origami, Tear and Paste activities for the children so that they learn in a healthy and entertaining manner.

We enthusiastically celebrate every festivity at Ashok's Kidz Paradise, fostering a sense of unity and joy among our students.

Recognizing the significance of value education in holistic child development, we earnestly observe special days and events such as Helper's Day and Grandparents Day to instil moral values among our children.

With utmost care and guidance, we gently guide our young learners from the familiar to the unknown world, ensuring a well-rounded educational experience.

Guidance and Counselling Cell

The guidance and counselling cell of the school is working to the varied educational and personal needs of the students and their parents from diverse social, cultural and religious background. Different problems of children are being addressed on individual as well as group level. The school is promoting inclusive education sincerely as, at present more than 60 students of special educational needs including visual, hearing impairment and muscular dystrophy have been enrolled. All accommodations, modifications and academic support are being provided to these students by our special educator.

The department also works extensively on preventions of bullying and child sexual abuse and creates awareness through regular sessions.

For senior children, career counselling and adolescent issues are being discussed on individual as well as group level.

The department also works on emotional and mental health of children and creates awareness from time to time. We try to create awareness among parents through individuals and group sessions.

Mental Health: Awareness Week

World Mental Health Day is on 10th October and the theme is **Mental Health is universal human right**. Our school has organised a week long mental health awareness program for the staff parents and students to raise awareness about mental health and the importance of taking care of oneself reducing stigma associated with the issue, promoting help seeking behaviour and emotional well being practices .The program was kick started on artistic and therapeutic note on 30.09.23 .The Mandala art activity was organised for the staff members and the Principal and school counsellor addressed the staff about mental health and wellbeing.

Mandala art is a type of art that uses geometrical shapes and patterns to create a sense of unity and harmony, the activity was designed to promote creativity and to help participants connect with their emotions. Week long activities for the staff and the parents and age appropriate activities for students of different segments like gratitude, bucket filling, accepting failure with dignity, celebrating yourself, eat healthy, be emotionally intelligent etc. were planned.
